First Lessons in Brush Work

from Elementary Brush-Work Studies by Elizabeth C. Yeats

Colours needed - Cobalt and gamboge.

- 1. First on this plate is shown a single dab or touch, made by filling the brush with colour, and simply pressing it upon the paper; the shape of the brush is left in green paint upon the paper.
- 2. The small heart-shaped leaf of Convolvulus is made by two of these touches, side by side, meeting at the point.
- 3. The Clover leaves are painted by three single dabs, the point of the brush being towards the centre of the leaf; or each leaflet made by two dabs, as shown at the top of the plate.
- 4. A twig of Yew; each leaf made by a single stroke of the brush, which must be slightly pressed upon the paper to widen the touch for the thickest part of the leaf.
